Premiere	●				✓	✓	✓✓	Suitable for early French fries, with medium yields, early bulking. Susceptible to late blight on foliage, Blackleg and potato virus Yo. Resistance to bruising and splitting. Susceptibility to potato cyst nematode.	
Rocket	●				✗	✓	✓✓	Possibly the earliest early with a very mild flavour. Produces huge crops of uniform attractive white tubers. Has double eelworm resistance, should not be left in ground. Good for boiling	
Ulster Prince	●				✓	✓	✓	Renowned for their boiling qualities when cooked straight after harvest. Excellent drought resistance, low resistance to late blight on foliage and late blight on tubers, dry rot, potato leafroll virus and potato virus Yo.
