## **Best Kept Allotment 2024**

Two independent judges scored the 20 shortlisted plots for Best Plot Overall and the 6 shortlisted plots for Best Newcomer 2024. The judges had a difficult task this year as it was a closely fought contest.

Adam H. (CR47B) scored the most points at Clothall Road and is the Best Plot at Clothall Road. Dave K. (NR49B/50B) scored the most points at North Road and is the Best Plot at North Road. Congratulations to Adam H., who scored the most points overall and will be awarded the Basil Bryant Cup. Winners will receive a £25 voucher to use at the Members' Shop. Presentations will be made at the 2025 AGM.





Here are the results for the newcomers: Kemjira S. (CR14A) scored the most points at Clothall Road and is the Best Newcomer at Clothall Road. Colin M. (NR60A) scored the most points at North Road and is the Best Newcomer at North Road. Kemjira will be awarded the Frank Conway Cup and Colin will be awarded the John Gray Cup at the 2025 AGM. In addition, the Best Newcomers will receive a £10 gift.

Members gathered to collect their Kings Seeds catalogues and meet the committee and other members. Phil (General Secretary) offered great advice about seed saving and demonstrated it with his tomatoes, allowing members to take seeds home and try growing them themselves. It was a wonderful opportunity for the community to come together, share ideas, discuss BALGA becoming a co-operative, and explore displays about biodiversity, the history of BALGA and allotments, and the NAS.

The produce is collected from the big black box near the large central gate at the Clothall Road site before 9 am every Friday during the main growing season, and from the big black box near the main gate at the North Road allotment site on a Wednesday evening.

Thank you to everyone who has been donating surplus produce to our local food banks—your generosity is truly making a difference! Please spread the word to your allotment neighbours so more people are aware of this opportunity to help others. Your contributions are greatly appreciated, and a big thanks to our volunteers who are collecting the produce and delivering it to the food banks.



## **Shop Update**

As usual, the BALGA shop will be selling a selection of garlic, onion sets, shallots, and spring bulbs. We will publicise when these are available, but we can confirm the prices will be as follows:

• Garlic: £0.70 per bulb

Onion Sets: £0.70 per 200g
Shallots: £0.90 per 250g
Daffodils: £1.30 per 500g
Tulips: £0.70 per 10 bulbs

Did you know that the shop now sells 1.5m tree stakes? A post driver is also available and can be borrowed for a small contribution.

#### **Allotment Waste**

We have been informed by North Herts Council that they have had to clear a number of fly-tips from the area by the bin at the Ivel Springs/North Road allotments car park. The materials were described as 'allotment-type waste.' The bin is provided for dog walkers' waste or litter only. Please dispose of your own waste by:

- Composting green waste
- Burning any perennial weeds or wood, while adhering to our bonfire advice
- Taking anything else to your household bin or a local recycling centre

Do not leave anything by the allotment gates or anywhere else around the site.
