## **Becoming a Cooperative**

At our BALGA Annual General Meeting (AGM) back in January, members present unanimously agreed that your committee should explore further the steps required for our Association to become a Cooperative, as strongly recommended by the National Allotment Society (NAS). The NAS has a model set of rules for a Cooperative, which your committee has been working to slightly adapt so that it better corresponds with our needs and which would then replace our current Constitution once registered with the Financial Conduct Authority. However, our current Constitution cannot be changed without the approval of two-thirds of the members present at a quorate AGM or EGM.

Your committee has agreed that rather than calling a face-to-face meeting, this can be more conveniently achieved by a paper EGM. Within the next few weeks, every current member will receive by email (or by paper for those not on email) a copy of the draft rules to give you all the opportunity to raise any questions or concerns you may have about it. Once any such issues have been satisfactorily answered, a separate form will allow your vote to be cast. A full explanation of the benefits and implications to BALGA, and you, its members, of making this change will also be enclosed. Come to our Open Day to find out more. Mick
