BALGA AGM

Thank you to the 53 members who attended our 2025 AGM on 20th January, several of whom had only recently joined our Association, plus a further 5 voting by proxy. The meeting began with presentations to the winners of the 2024 Best Kept Allotment Competition before receiving the various reports listed on the agenda.

The main business focused on BALGA becoming a Co-operative which, following a presentation by Phil reiterating the advantages of such a move and after some discussion, was approved by an overwhelming majority as were the Model Rules that will replace our existing Constitution. Phil then gave an illustrated update on the progress of work on the North Road site extension; since the meeting that work is now almost complete.

Moving on from the AGM the Model Rules and formal application have now been forwarded to the National Allotment Society. acting as our sponsors, for submission to the Financial Conduct Authority for those Rules to be approved and registered.

It will be necessary to call a further General Meeting once the Rules have been approved to agree minor amendments not made in this submission and to keep the cost to the minimum £120 actually paid. Once registered such amendments to the Rules are free. The new Membership Agreement and Committee Procedure plus the amended Tenancy Agreement also need to be approved. We look forward to your continued support at that future meeting.

After those changes have been registered, we will all be required to sign the new Member's Agreement, and Tenancy Agreement.
